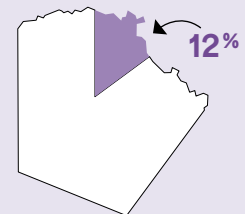
Additional support helps older adults remain safely in their homes by addressing critical safety concerns, providing minor home repairs, and reducing legal barriers that can threaten housing stability.
